

What to Do This Week in Election 2020! (Tuesday 5/26 to Friday 5/29)

There are potentially only two items to think about this week.

The first is making sure you get full credit for the class. I've included the "minimum standard" notice from week six in the resource list for this week so that you can make sure you've done everything you need to do. Tuesday 5/26

We have class at 12:30. In class, what I'd like to do is put you in small groups and practice answering questions in political style. I also want to make sure everyone has 3 questions to answer, so to that end I'll be providing everyone with a menu of questions to practice asking one another. In the end, you should be answering a question you made up for your candidate to answer, a question from the list, and a question that I will give you personally.

Thursday 5/28

This is a good day to write and record your debate answers. There will be a space on Flipgrid to do this, along with directions to make it clear what question you are answering in your videos. Bonus points for dressing up in politician clothes/making yourself look like your candidate. Even more bonus points if you have a fancy background. We will also meet at 7pm for a politics discussion as usual.

Friday 5/29

This is also a day to record your debate answers. Remember also to add a short reflection on your work - this doesn't need to be more than a couple of paragraphs long. The prompt for the reflection is one of the pages for this week's work.

If you are finished recording answers, writing your reflection, and handing in any previous work, congratulations, you have completed the course! Next week we revise!
