Task #3: (Wednesday) Process Work Revision

Task #4 (Thursday): Begin Writing Text [put about 45 minutes into it today!]

The text of your PowerPoint should be written in the notes section of each individual slide.

- Please write the text in formal voice as you would speak it.
- When you use a quotation or a specific fact, please use an in-text citation
- Remember that this is your opportunity to show off how many facts, quotes, and ideas you can plug in to support your claim!
